**FOR THE FIRST TIME ...
IN ARAD...**

In 1833, after Paris, Prague, Brussels, Vienna and London, the sixth European music conservatory was founded in Arad.



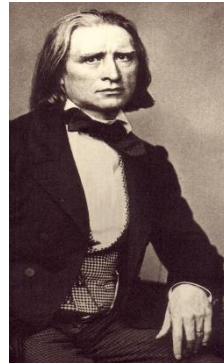
In 1836 Anton Dargl opened an organs factory, unique in this part of Europe.



In 1812-Preparandia Română was the first Romanian pedagogical school, founded in Arad



Over the time, a large number of great artists sang in Arad: Franz Liszt (1846), Johann Strauss (1847), Pablo Sarsate (1877), Henryk Wieniawski (1877), George Enescu (1922) Bela Bartok (1924).

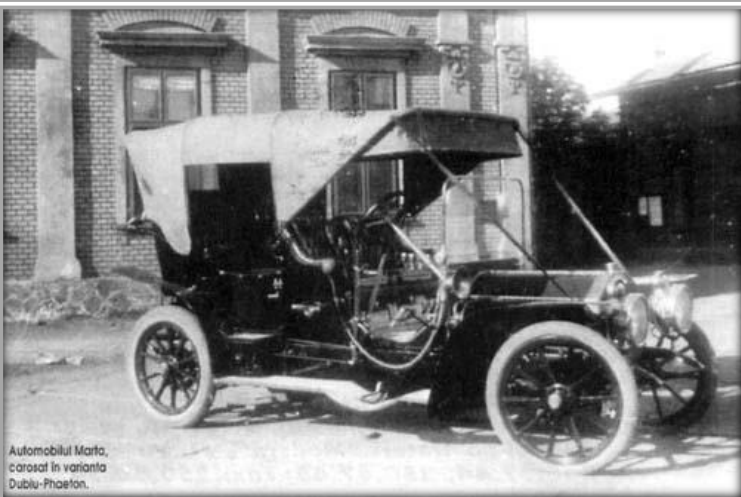

from Arad



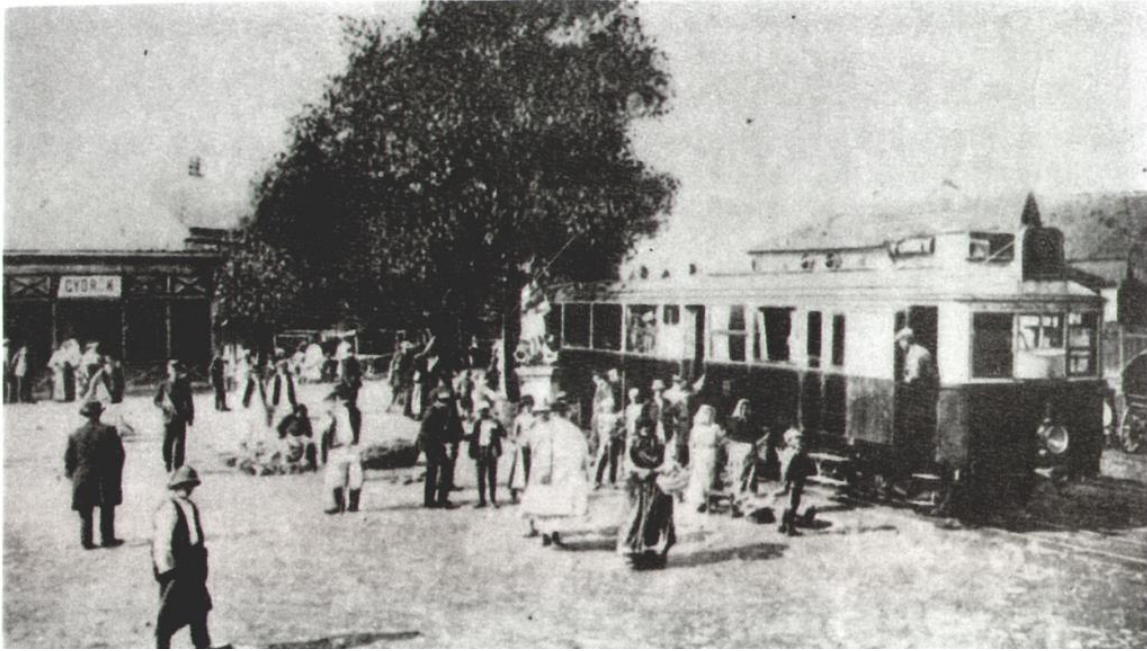
The first automobile in our region was made at “Marta” factory in 1909.

The first electric railway in Eastern Europe and the eight in the world was inaugurated on Arad-Podgoria route, on 10th of April 1913.



Francisc Neuman Stadium was a football stadium in Arad, built in 1940 and inaugurated on September 1, 1946. At that time, the stadium was considered the most beautiful stadium from Romania. The football stadium was demolished in 2014, but another one was built in the same place and with the same name.
